Bee Facts:

- There are three kinds of bees in a hive: Queen, Worker and Drone.
- Bees have two stomachs one stomach for eating and the other special stomach is for storing nectar collected from flowers or water so that they can carry it back to their hive.
- Male drone bees don't have a stinger.
- If a worker bee uses her stinger, she will die.
- Bees are the only insect in the world that makes food for humans.
- Honey was found in the tombs in Egypt and it was still edible! Bees have been here around 30 million years.
- Without bees pollinating plants, there would not be as many fruits or vegetables to eat.
- A single beehive can make more than 100 pounds (45 kg) of extra honey. The beekeeper only harvests the extra honey made by the bees.
- Honey comes in different colors and flavors. The flower where the nectar was gathered from determines the flavor and color of the honey.
- When honey bees sting, pheromones are released that can incite other nearby bees to join the attack. One stinging bee can turn into hundreds or even thousands of stinging bees in just a short time.
- Honey bees are attracted to sugar. They come after sweet stuff during a drought or the very hottest day of summer when flowers are scarce.
- Bees are genuinely mild mannered, and usually will not sting you unless you pose a threat to them or provoke them. They only want to do their job collecting pollen, but they will defend themselves if they need to.

Treating Bee Stings:

Follow these simple steps for treating benign bee stings:

If you are stung by a honey bee, part of the sting will remain in the skin. If this is the case, immediately seek to scrape this away with a clean blunt instrument, or wipe it away with the flat of the hand. It is best to remove the sting quickly, as it will continue to pump bee venom into the sting. If you believe your reaction to a sting is not serious, you may wish to try a natural bee sting treatment, or a home remedy. More serious sting reactions could include nausea, vomiting, palpitations, faintness, and abdominal pains. Seek medical advice immediately.
